

RESOLUTION 14-2006

A RESOLUTION OPPOSING THE CONSTRUCTION OF LARGE  
SCALE DAIRY FARMS NEAR WOODVILLE, OHIO

WHEREAS, the Council of the Village of Woodville, Sandusky County, Ohio has a responsibility to oversee the general health and welfare of the Citizens of the Village of Woodville; and

WHEREAS, the large dairy facility proposed to be constructed in Sandusky County, Ohio could place a tremendous demand on the water supply and pose potential environmental hazards to the surrounding area; and

WHEREAS, there have been serious concerns expressed about the negative impact the dairy operation could have on the quality of life in the Village of Woodville including odor, contamination of groundwater and wells, excess consumption of well water and possible negative impact on property values.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Woodville, Sandusky County, Ohio:

1. That the proposed large scale dairy farm may not be in the best interests of the residents of the Village of Woodville.
2. That the potential for water and air contamination, decrease in well water supply, road damage and loss of tax base is unacceptable.
3. Woodville Village Council opposes any permit for the construction of any large-scale dairy farm in the area until the State of Ohio can guarantee that the dairy farm poses no threat to public safety and health in the area.
4. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of the Village of Woodville concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
